

INTRODUCTION

- 3. Loneliness, emptiness, isolation ... everybody has those feelings at times.
 - a. You can be lonely in a crowd at a ball game, can't you? How? Discuss.
 - b. Can't you feel lonely in school, or maybe even in Bible class?
 - c. Can't you feel like an outsider?
- 4. Have you ever felt funny ... not wanting to be left out but knowing that what your friends are about to do isn't right? Discuss.
 - a. Have you ever lost a good friend or a member of your family in death?
 - b. Have you ever felt miserable and depressed?
- 5. Well, if you have, there's good news! Cheer up! You're not all alone! Somebody cares!
- 6. Read Hebrews 13:5; Deuteronomy 31:6; Psalm 118-6,7.

- 3. Yet, when the king's wife, Jezebel threatened him with death, he suddenly felt all alone, 1 Kings 19:1-3.
 - a. Would you have been afraid?
 - b. Are you ever afraid that someday you'll just give in and follow the crowd?
- 4. Well, Elijah must have felt this way! Yet, he learned he wasn't the only one who still wanted to serve Jehovah, 1 Kings 19:18.
 - a. God is never overwhelmed when evil surrounds you.
 - b. Read Psalm 37:28. What does this verse tell you?
- 5. You see, Elijah forgot for a moment just how powerful and dependable God really is!
 - a. Do you ever forget this fact?
 - b. Can the presence of God, Psalm 139, be a source of encouragement to us? How?
 - c. Read and discuss Isaiah 41:10.
- 6. Now read Proverbs 16:7.
 - a. Elijah saw the principle of this verse in action as God went to great lengths to provide him with peace and quiet.
 - b. God protected him from Jezebel; He sent the whole Syrian army to keep Ahab occupied!
